The top U.N. official for Libya warned that the conflict-torn North African country is at “a decisive turning point”, with foreign backers of its rival governments pouring in weapons and the misery of its people compounded by the CORONAVIRUS pandemic that appears to be “spiraling out of control“. Its fallout will worsen the humanitarian suffering of Libya’s civil war and possibly reconfigure the tempo and geographic scope of the conflict. Early attempts to halt the hostilities in order to deal with the outbreak have faltered; so far, the warring parties and their foreign backers seem committed to escalating the fighting around Tripoli.
